Comic Lily Tomlin once joked, "I've always wanted to be somebody, but I see now that I should have been more specific." Something similar could be said for the way we as Christians should give witness to our faith. We all know that a major part of following Jesus is sharing our faith with others. Still a big part of that sharing depends on being 'specific' about who we are to begin with. If our witness as Christians is vague or unclear it will also be ineffective – whether to our friends, family, or even our children.

As we celebrate our 75th anniversary as a congregation this year it's good to remind ourselves how specifically committed St. Luke's has been to the message of the Gospel throughout our history. Despite the changes we've experienced, this has been a Spirit-led constant for us over the years — and we should continue to embrace it. St. Luke's has a strong tradition of being specific about what we preach and how we live out the Gospel, while being open and friendly to whoever wishes to join us.

This tradition is important to build upon in a time when fewer and fewer people even seem to know what Christians believe. It's especially important in a time when being 'spiritual' in vague self-chosen ways tends to trump the confession of biblically-grounded truths. In other words, it's cool to be uncommitted. These social pressures can force us into being vague about our own beliefs, even to ourselves. Yes, as Christians we're certainly called to respect others we don't agree with as fellow human being created in God's image. At the same time, we should never play down our commitment to Jesus and his teaching just to be popular or comfortable.

Being a Christian, and being a church, means following Jesus. Jesus himself came to us as a specific person in a specific time and place – 2000 years ago when the land of Israel was occupied by the Roman Empire. He was also, specifically, the eternal Son of God who rose from the dead on Easter Day for the salvation of the world. Who we are as Christians, and again as St. Luke's, depends upon believing and proclaiming these and other specific things.

It might be encouraging to know that Jesus' first followers also lived in a time when being specific about what one believed wasn't acceptable. During the first several centuries of Christianity, many people thought Christians were strange because they believed in more than one God. But this didn't stop them from telling the story how it actually was. In fact,

Christianity spread rapidly because of it.

To be 'somebody' for the faith, we need to stay specific in our beliefs as Christians, and as a congregation as well. As we do, the witness of St. Luke's should be good for another 75 years at least.

THE PROCESS OF OUR PASTORAL CALL...

WHY ARE WE LOOKING FOR A SENIOR PASTOR?

- At their September 12th meeting, the Church Council commissioned Worship to form an Exploratory Committee to *define the pastoral needs for St Luke's*
- Members of this Committee were:
 - Pastor Carlton Andersen Congregational Advisor
 - Pastor Dave Ficken Circuit Visitation Advisor
 - Holly Johnson
 - Jodi Lubeck
 - Jeff Rieckenberg
 - Jim Nooyen
 - Ron Herman
 - Elaine Herman
 - Katie Johnson
 - Chuck Gibbons
- The first meeting was held on October 17th. Discussion included the following:
 - There are things to consider in our discussions. <u>Pastor Carlton does plan to retire in the next few years</u>. Is it time to evaluate and think about a combination of LCMS churches in the area Immanuel, St. John, St. Luke's? Each of us needs to do a prayerful self-evaluation of St. Luke's strengths, weaknesses, and where we want to go/who do we want to be as a congregation.
- A six-question survey was sent to the congregation. The answers were summarized and follow each question (shown below):

XIII. Congregational Goals

- 1. How would you summarize the purpose for which your congregation exists?
 - We at St. Luke's dedicate ourselves to grow in faith and love, to serve together, and to reach out with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Worship, Prayer, Education, Service, Support, Fellowship, Evangelism, and Missions are among our priorities.
- 2. What opportunities is God opening for the congregation to explore?
 - A realistic expenditure with a greater focus on facility use, technology, staff expectations, and increasing volunteers in all areas. Engage younger inactive groups (ages 30-50), expand fellowship with other LCMS groups, and expand studies.
- 3. List at least 3 areas in which you feel the congregation is strong (things the congregation does well by God's blessing).
 - Meeting spiritual needs by offering a variety of support through worship, music, technology use, Bible studies and Youth groups.
 - Connected to others in care ministries, Lutheran school partnerships, great Preschool staff, and missionary support and disadvantaged members.
 - Providing tradition and seeking growth for the future.
- 4. Are there any new things God wants your congregation to be doing which it is not doing now?
 - Get younger people involved, engage in change, evangelism, stewardship, discipleship, and the ways of communication through our ministry opportunities. Interact with Christian counseling office, work with international students, strengthen connections to partnership and preschool families.

- 5. What things the congregation is now doing do you believe God is calling to be done better?
 - Enhance receptiveness/welcomeness towards guests and all members, encourage Sunday school involvement, evangelism, better men's group opportunities, increase use of technology.
- 6. What are two things that you believe your congregation needs more than anything else right now, to be most effective?
 - Leadership, encouragement to guide congregation to grow and connect.
 - Younger involvement and volunteering consistently.
- The second meeting was held on November 2nd. The major points coming from that meeting were:
- Pastor Carlton shared with the group that he is looking to retire in the summer of 2025, no exact date established at this time. He will remain flexible in the transition process. Discussion then included the call process, Associate Pastor with some experience, proven Senior Pastor, Vicar support during this transition process. The committee concluded that the best path forward was to call a Senior Pastor and to get our name on the list to consider a Vicar.
- The third and final meeting was held on December 5th.
- Final discussion was held and concluded that our recommendation at this time is to form a <u>Call</u> <u>Committee to find a Senior Pastor</u>. Worship sent this recommendation to the Church Council for their December meeting. At the December 12th Church Council meeting the formation of a <u>Call</u> <u>Committee for a new Senior Pastor was approved</u>.

NOTE:

- We were unsuccessful in our application for a Vicar; as we were not selected to receive one.
- It is important to have a Senior Pastor in place prior to considering a call for an Associate Pastor. Once we have found and secured our new Senior Pastor, and with his input, we will proceed to hire any additional staff that is deemed necessary for St. Luke's.
- Remember, Our Father already has a pastoral plan in place for St. Luke's, he just has not revealed all of it to us yet: His will be done!
- Additional information from the Call Committee will be shared in upcoming monthly newsletters.

A Note of Thanks....

Dear St. Lukes Family,

Thank you so much for your continued support through the financial gift you gave to help me get to India as well as all the support over the years.

I have recently connected with an organization called Bible Faith Lutheran Ministries to India. I'm now part of their organization and during my time in India I got to see what they do and how their organization works plus do some mission work. Their ministry has three main focuses. The first being the Moriah School where they educate over 200 kids through a Gospel focused approach. They have about 10-20 kids who come from less fortunate homes who stay there full time during the school year. The next ministry focus is Bible Faith Lutheran Churches which are about 40 congregations within 70 miles of Guntar, India. They also have a seminary to help train Indians who desire to serve God in the pastoral office and then do continuing ed and pre seminary training. The last ministry focus is Indian Bible Study Project which is working on translating the Lutheran Study Bible into the 15 main languages of India. The first translation will be done in Telegu and hopefully done by October/November of this year.

I hope to continue this work with Bible Faith Lutheran Ministries to India and to go back in January. Thanks

• There are 10 shooting lanes and 10 kids for Bibles and Bows, just a couple of sessions left.


Other Business:

Spring work has begun. Some of the normal "fall" work is being completed and the area is looking a bit neater. Soon it will be warm enough to start up the water feature. Last year electricity was run directly to the feature so we were finally able to hook it up to a timer and have it running most of the day and evening. It is so beautiful when the water is trickling and that sound fills the air.



Goals this summer include finishing a small planting area of shrubs on the east side of the path, installing the memorial bricks received last summer, incorporating the flag into the planting area to the south of it and keeping up with the weeding and mulching. We had prayed for more help from the gardeners in our congregation, possibly even starting a couple smaller beds along the path but that has not happened yet. Our small committee of 3 active worker bees just cannot add more beds <u>and</u> maintain the ones we have, so we will keep the area as is for this year and see what happens in 2025.

Property Care will also be installing a water pump closer to the planting areas to make it easier to keep plants watered and looking nice. A good share of the plants we put in are heat and drought resistant but there are those which just need some fresh water a couple times a week to keep their color and longevity.

As always, we welcome help with ongoing maintenance, weeding and watering. If you wish to purchase a memory brick, orders are being taken now for a limited time in May. General donations are always appreciated, as well as donations for specific trees or shrubs in memory of loved ones or in celebration of a special event. These donations should be directed to the "Landscaping Fund".

We thank those who have donated to the development of this Memorial Garden. It's been a long time coming but is finally really establishing itself. We have people who walk the path each day as they have incorporated it into their daily walk. We love that!



EARLY ST. LUKE'S MEMORIES

On February 4, 1950 our first church was dedicated to God's glory. The day was full of activities, including a dedication ceremony conducted by our first Pastor, L. F. Schneider, sermon by the vice-president of the North Wisconsin District, the mayor brought a congratulatory message on behalf of the city, an afternoon service was held with Pastor Kuechle who spoke on

behalf of Immanuel Lutheran Church. An evening informal gathering included Pastor Ludwig, Correspondent of Missions, who was zealous in assisting St. Luke's in the early stages. Members were encouraged to continue working and praying for St. Luke's in this work of Christ and "victory will be yours"! 715 worshippers attended the services on this day.



By 1952, the small church had become so crowded that the balcony was enlarged to allow more seating. It was at this time that another service would be held on Sundays to alleviate the crowding. The September 30, 1956 with dedication on February 3, 1957. Our church was known at this time and for many years forward as "the children's church" because we had so many children. In 1969 it was decided that we needed

more teaching and activity space so ground was broken for the Schneider Education Center. This building included a gymnasium which saw many basketball games of church teams around the central WI area, new church offices, and classroom areas for Sunday School and eventually St. Luke's Preschool.

Over the years an addition was built onto the east end of the Schneider Center which added the four large classrooms for confirmation classes and more Sunday School space. The narthex was increased in size in 1986, eliminating the outdoor stairway to the church entrance and adding a chair lift. The sanctuary was renovated at this time. By this time St. Luke's had grown in 50 years from 23 families to 700 units and from a baptized membership of 102 to over 1650.

For any of us here during most of those years, there are so many memories of inspiring and uplifting services and sermons, special moments of weddings, baptisms, confirmations, and yes, even funerals of many of the wonderful, dedicated people that worked so hard to start and grow St. Luke's. Twelve pastors have served, four vicars, three D.C.E's and one Deacon. 

- 5. Love your neighbors in obedience to God.
 - And the King will answer them, "Truly I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these, my brother, you did it to me." Matthew 25:40

These items are hard to do all the time. If we don't equip ourselves by knowing his word, asking for his guidance, follow his leading, and being in the body of Christ.

There are many more scriptures on faithfulness. As we read these scriptures and think about them here are couple of questions that come to mind:
