Luke Lines

Classic detective stories often focus on the keen powers of observation a detective uses to solve a crime. Sherlock Holmes, for example, was legendary for letting no clue go unnoticed. At the scene of a crime he'd attend to even the smallest relevant details – things less observant people like us would miss.

As we'll be learning, among other things, in our Bible Overview in our Sunday classes this winter, the scriptures talk a lot about God's powers of observation, too. The difference is that God's attention to the details is infinite. The Bible says that not even a sparrow falls apart from the will of the Father, and that every hair on our head is counted. (Matthew 10:29-30) There isn't one thing in the universe that happens that escapes the notice of our Creator. God sees and knows all things.

This infinite knowledge of God – or what we call God's 'omniscience' – is an amazing thing to think about. It can be a scary thing to think about, too – especially when we apply it to our lives. Jeremiah 17:10 tells us: "I, the Lord, search the heart and examine the mind." The fact that God knows everything not only means that God knows everything we do, He also knows every thought, wish and feeling we have. He knows what we're like in private as well as in public. He knows what's in the deepest depths of our heart. There's nowhere we can hide from God.

Scary as this sounds, there's a very good side to God's infinite knowledge. And that is that, because God knows everything about us, he knows our situation and our need for forgiveness even better than we do ourselves. And — as baptized, believing members of God's church, he knows us through the love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ. God doesn't search our heart like a detective solving a crime. He searches it like a Savior who wants to change us and bring us even closer to his own heart.

God sees everything there is, was, and will be. His knowledge is wide and deep. So is his love. The good news is that this all-knowing God wants to know us completely through Jesus Christ. That's something we should know about for ourselves in as much detail as possible.

THE PROCESS OF OUR PASTORAL CALL... SEARCH FOR A NEW CALL CANDIDATE...PART 10 TIME TO GET BACK TO WORK!

The monthly newsletter updates are published to keep the congregation informed of where we are at in the Call Process as we look for a Senior Pastor...

- On Monday, January 6th, the Call Committee met with Pastor Steve Hulke, our interim Circuit Visitation Pastor. He personally delivered the new list of pastoral candidates that District President Lueck gave to him. The list contained 11 potential candidate names. In addition to that list, we received 3 pastoral candidate names submitted from our congregation. We also have 1 candidate to consider from the 1st list that we received from President Lueck last Spring.
- On Wednesday and Thursday, January 8th and 9th we personally called all the call list pastoral candidates to determine if they would be able to consider a call from us at this time. After completing the calls, we have pared the list down to 9 candidates open to considering a call and 1 pastor who is undecided but will let us know (not sure how soon)?
- The Call Committee is meeting on January 15th to start to evaluate the candidates left on the list. We need to discuss and decide which of the 11 candidates open to a call would be a good fit for St. Luke's. Over the next few weeks, we hope to decide which pastors we feel would be right for our congregation and set up interview dates with them.
- Please keep us in your prayers as we work through the candidates, it is a very long and tedious assignment that we have undertaken. We understand that Our Father has already selected our next Senior Pastor, and that it our task to search that pastor out. Let's all pray that one of these candidates is the Shepherd that he has chosen to lead St. Luke's into the future.
- At our Congregational Meeting in December, I was also instructed to submit the application paperwork to District for a Seminary Placement to serve as our Associate Pastor (if we were selected to receive an ordained graduate from Seminary). The initial request has been submitted and the more detailed application paperwork is nearly complete. All paperwork for the application should be completed and submitted to District by the end of January.

• If I Make My Bed In Hell by John B. Porter

The title actually comes from Psalm 139 verse 8 in the KJV – "If I ascend up into heaven, thou art there: if I make my bed in hell, thou art there." Being a pastor, he knows this but after seeing all that happens while in Viet Nam, Chaplain Grayson is himself caught in a web of doubt. How can he be a source of strength when he finds his own faith slipping? This is his story. Here is his knowledge that, no matter what kind of hell a man falls into, God is there, still caring and waiting to bring him out.



Seeing The Good In It by Phil Zielke

This is the story of Phil's fight with cancer, twice, and what he learned along the way. In your darkest times, who is there for you? What is your source of strength and peace? What promises can you cling to that actually bring hope? These are the questions Phil wrestled with as he learned that his determination and self-confidence were no longer enough. This brought him to a greater intimacy with God and a desire to help others in similar situations. This is how Phil's Friends—a ministry that sends cards and care packages to those with cancer—was born. There are reflection questions at the end of each chapter, Phil encourages readers to see God's hand in the story of their lives and discover the good in even life's most difficult circumstances.

Phil's Friends is now Elizabeth Circle's mission.



Proverbs 28:1—the wicked flee when no one pursues, but the righteous are bold as a lion.


Psalm 107:1— Oh give thanks to the Lord, for he is good for his steadfast love endures forever!
