Luke Lines

For many of our churches, including Lutheran ones like ours, January 12th will be Epiphany Sunday. In the early days of Christianity, the day of Epiphany – which is actually January 6th – was a major holiday of worship more important than Christmas itself. The main theme of the holiday is the manifestation, or revelation, of God to the world through the person of Jesus Christ. Epiphany is also celebrated, as it is here at St. Luke's, as an entire season of the church year usually lasting some five to seven weeks.

We also associate the day or Sunday of Epiphany with the coming of the Wise Men to bring gifts to a newborn King named Jesus. Three magi, or royal astrologers, from lands somewhere east of Israel, see a large and unusual star rise in the heavens and follow it to the home of the Christ child. Disappointing as it might be to those of us who love manger scenes, the wise men probably didn't show up on Christmas eve. They arrive to worship Jesus at least some weeks later. Either way, when they find the child, they present him with gifts.

How the wise men knew the significance of this bright guiding star we don't know. But the Gospel of Matthew tells us the purpose of their coming. When the magi arrive in Jerusalem they ask: "Where is he who is born King of the Jews? We have seen his star when it rose and have come to worship him." (Matthew 2:2). This means that God set a special star in the heavens for the sole purpose of guiding these men to a place where they could worship Jesus. They traveled for weeks for that single reason – to worship the Son of God.

God guides us too for the sole purpose of bringing us closer to Him, especially through our worship. One of the reasons He created us, in fact, is to worship and glorify Him as our Creator and Redeemer. God even leads us over long distances in our lives to bring us to a higher level of worshipping Him. Like the wise men in Matthew 2, he created us to be worshipping creatures. So given who we are, we'll be restless in our souls until we fulfill that purpose.

With that lesson in mind, let me encourage you, during this Epiphany season, to worship your newborn King too. Even if, like the wise men, it means a bit of travel or inconvenience on your part. Unlike the wise men you don't have to bring gold, frankincense, or myrrh. You just have to come and receive the saving gifts Christ has for you.

The monthly newsletter updates are published to keep the congregation informed of where we are at in the Call Process as we look for a Senior Pastor...

- We extended a call to Pastor David Schultz of St Paul, Wood River, Illinois on November 13th. We gave him until January 13th to either accept or decline our call. On December 2th we held a Zoom meeting with him to answer any questions that he may have had about St. Luke's. The meeting went quite well.
- Early Friday, December 6th, Pastor Schultz notified me that he was returning his call to us. Although he was impressed with St. Luke's, our Heavenly Father moved him to stay at St Paul, Wood River as he has further work to do there before taking a call.
- On Monday, December 9th, we contacted Pastor Steve Hulke, our interim Circuit Visitation Pastor, to inform him of our need for his assistance in getting a new, updated, pastoral candidate call list from District President Rev. Dwayne Lueck.
- We will also accept pastoral nominations from the congregation until we get the list back from District. There will be congregational nomination forms placed in the Narthex and the Overflow areas, feel free to nominate a pastor that you think would be a great senior pastor for St. Luke's.
- The Call Committee will start meeting again as soon as we receive the new call list from Pastor Hulke and/or Rev. Dr. Lueck. The call committee should be back in session sometime mid-January.
- We will be allowed to use any pastoral candidate names form our previous call list if there is a pastor of interest on that list. We do have a potential strong candidate from that list that will be carried over for further discussion and review when we start meeting again.
- Thank you for all the prayers and support that you have given/shown for us. Please continue with the prayers for the call committee, for St. Luke's congregation, and for whoever our Heavenly Father has already selected to be the next Shepherd for St. Luke's.

NOTE We may be able to apply for a Seminary Placement from the 2025 Missouri Synod Seminary graduating class pending congregational approval and submission of the application form before March 1, 2025.






