



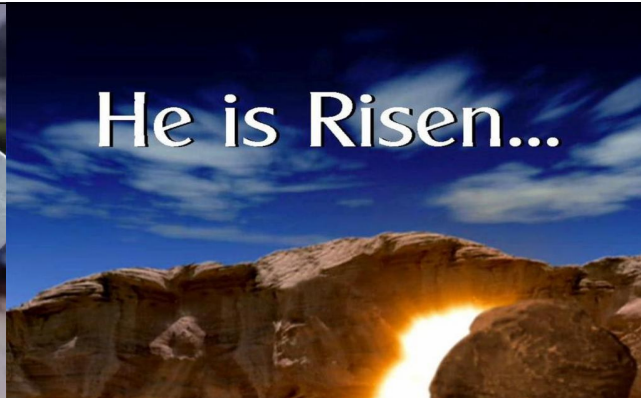

St. Luke's youth seek to be united in Christ, share His love and celebrate our growth in faith.

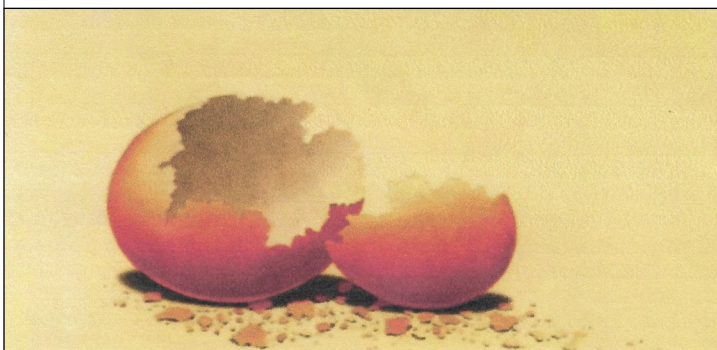
