There are so many people that Anna and I would like to thank for making our time here at St. Luke's special, but there's no way I can list them all. Instead, I'd just like to leave you with a scripture that I hope might be helpful for looking ahead to the future of this congregation. It's from the end of Acts 2 and describes what the very early Christian church experienced.

"And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread, and to prayer." (Acts 2:42)

Did you catch the four things in that verse that make for a spiritually thriving church?

- 1) The 'apostles teaching, that is, the hearing and study of the Bible
- 2) The 'fellowship' of supporting one other in love
- 3) The 'breaking of bread,' that is, worshipping and sharing Holy Communion together.
- 4) The practice of prayer, not only for the world but for each other.

Throughout its history St. Luke's has always striven to accomplish that four-fold vision of Christ's church, and has been successful in doing so in many areas and many ways. Still, let me encourage you to not only continue to do so, but trust the Spirit to take you further than what you've even imagined so far.

The monthly newsletter updates are published to keep the congregation informed of where we are at in the Call Process as we look for a Senior Pastor...

- The Call to Pastor Greg Hovland was placed on April 23rd. He sent a letter to St. Luke's on April 29th, acknowledging receipt of the Call Documents and his need for prayers as he began his Call deliberations and prayerful consideration. On Monday, May 5th, I received a telephone call from Pastor Hovland to inform me that he is returning our Call to him. He wishes us the best in our continued pursuit of calling a Senior Pastor, hoping that soon we will find the pastor that Our Father has selected to lead St. Luke's.
- We have requested a new call list from Circuit Visitation Pastor Steve Hulke. He told us that District President Rev. Dr. Lueck has the list almost complete and that it will be delivered to us in the next week or so. At that time, we will schedule a meeting for the Call Committee to resume our directive to research and recommend a Senior Pastor for St. Luke's to place a Call to.
- There are also nomination forms in the overflow and narthex entries to the Sanctuary. If you know of a pastor that you would like to submit their name as a Senior Pastor candidate, fill the form out and turn it into the office or to a Call Committee member by June 1st.
- As we said in last month's update letter...The Call Committee has been working on this call process for a year and a half now. We have spent countless hours researching, evaluating, and interviewing pastoral candidates. It is tiring and at times frustrating, but at the same time we have met some awesome pastors. The Lord works in mysterious ways at times. We will find the right Senior Pastor for St. Luke's according to His Will and in His Time. As a committee, we have learned that the call process is a journey and not a destination!

This protects the church from being sued in the case it is not legitimate. The guidelines came directly from LCMS. The council will meet again in May to discuss the policy.
