"Gifts Given, Gifts Received, Gifts Entrusted" by Pastor Corey Shaffer

Christmas has a way of filling our hands and hearts at the same time. As one year closes and another begins, it's worth asking not only what we received—but what God now places in our care to carry forward.

As Christmas has come and gone, my family and I want you to know how grateful we are for the many cards, notes, and gifts you shared with us. Each one was received with genuine thanksgiving—not simply for what was given, but for the care and encouragement they represented. We are truly blessed to serve among people who know how to give thoughtfully and generously.

As we step into a new year, pause to reflect on what it really means to receive a gift.

In Scripture, gifts are rarely given merely for enjoyment or display. They're given with purpose. Whether it is material provision, encouragement at the right moment, or the forgiveness of sins itself, God's gifts always come with direction attached. What we receive is entrusted to us—not to hoard, but to steward; not to keep to ourselves, but to pass along in love.

This is true in obvious ways. Financial resources are entrusted to be used wisely and generously. Time is entrusted to be spent in service to God and neighbor. Abilities are entrusted to build up others rather than ourselves. But it is also true in quieter, more easily overlooked ways. Encouragement received becomes encouragement offered. Mercy shown to us becomes mercy extended to others. Forgiveness spoken over us becomes forgiveness practiced in our own relationships.

At the center of all this stands the greatest gift of all: the forgiveness of sins in Christ Jesus. Unlike every other gift we receive, this one is neither given because we have earned it, nor its usage exhausted by our use. The more it is trusted, the more it is shared. The more it is lived in, the more it shapes how we live with one another. As we begin a new year, we do not move forward empty-handed. We move forward carrying Christ's mercy with us.

That reality quietly reorients how we see the year ahead. The question is not simply, "What will this year bring?" but also, "What has God already placed in my hands to be used for the good of others?" The answer may look ordinary: patience in a difficult situation, a listening ear, a willingness to serve without recognition, a word of Gospel hope spoken at the right time. Yet God delights to work through such ordinary gifts.

As we enter this new year together, may we receive with thanksgiving—and serve with joy—trusting that the God who gives so freely will continue to supply everything we need for faith and life.

Council approved the proposed 2026 church budget and will bring it to the congregation for a vote at the meeting on December 14, 2025.


Second reading of the Qualifications of a Pastor was read and approved by council and will bring to the congregational meeting for a vote on December 14, 2025


