## “Call Day Is Coming—Let’s Watch Together!”

There’s something special about a moment when the future meets the present—when prayers, plans, and God’s providence all come together in one place. That’s exactly what happens on “Call Day” at Concordia Seminary St. Louis (CSL), and this year you’re invited to be part of it.

On Tuesday, April 28th at 7:00 PM, the Seminary will hold its annual Call Day service, where graduating seminarians receive their first pastoral calls into congregations across the country (and sometimes around the world!). It is a joyful, Christ-centered service filled with anticipation, thanksgiving, and more than a few surprises.

And this year, it’s especially meaningful for us at St. Luke’s.

Back in December, our congregation made the decision to travel to the Seminary for interviews. We met with three outstanding candidates—each one a faithful servant, each one (along with his wife, where applicable) demonstrating a heart for ministry and a love for Christ’s people. After much prayer and thoughtful discussion, our Call Committee and congregation voted this month to extend a Call to one of those graduates.

Now comes the part that requires patience... and maybe a little suspense.

We don’t know if we will receive a pastor. The Call system does not guarantee that our request will be fulfilled. The decision ultimately rests in the Lord’s hands as He works through the Seminary’s placement process. That means we won’t find out ahead of time.

We’ll find out live!

That’s why I want to encourage you—make plans to watch the Call Day service. A livestream will be available on Facebook, YouTube, and directly at [csl.edu/live](https://www.csl.edu/live). You can also find all the details and links here: <https://www.csl.edu/2026/03/call-day-2026-set-for-april-28/>

If you’ve never watched Call Day before, it’s worth it. Names are announced one by one, calls are revealed, and you can feel the collective joy (and sometimes nervous laughter!) as men are sent into the Lord’s harvest. Who knows—at some point that evening, you might hear the name of a new Associate Pastor for St. Luke’s.

And if technology isn’t your thing, consider watching with a friend or family member. Most phones can access the stream easily, and it might even turn into a meaningful shared experience.

In the meantime, we pray. We pray for the Seminary, for the graduates, and for the congregations awaiting pastors—including our own. Above all, we trust the Lord of the Church.

As Jesus says in Matthew 9:38: *“Pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest.”*

So we pray—and then we watch. I hope you’ll join me, Pastor Corey.

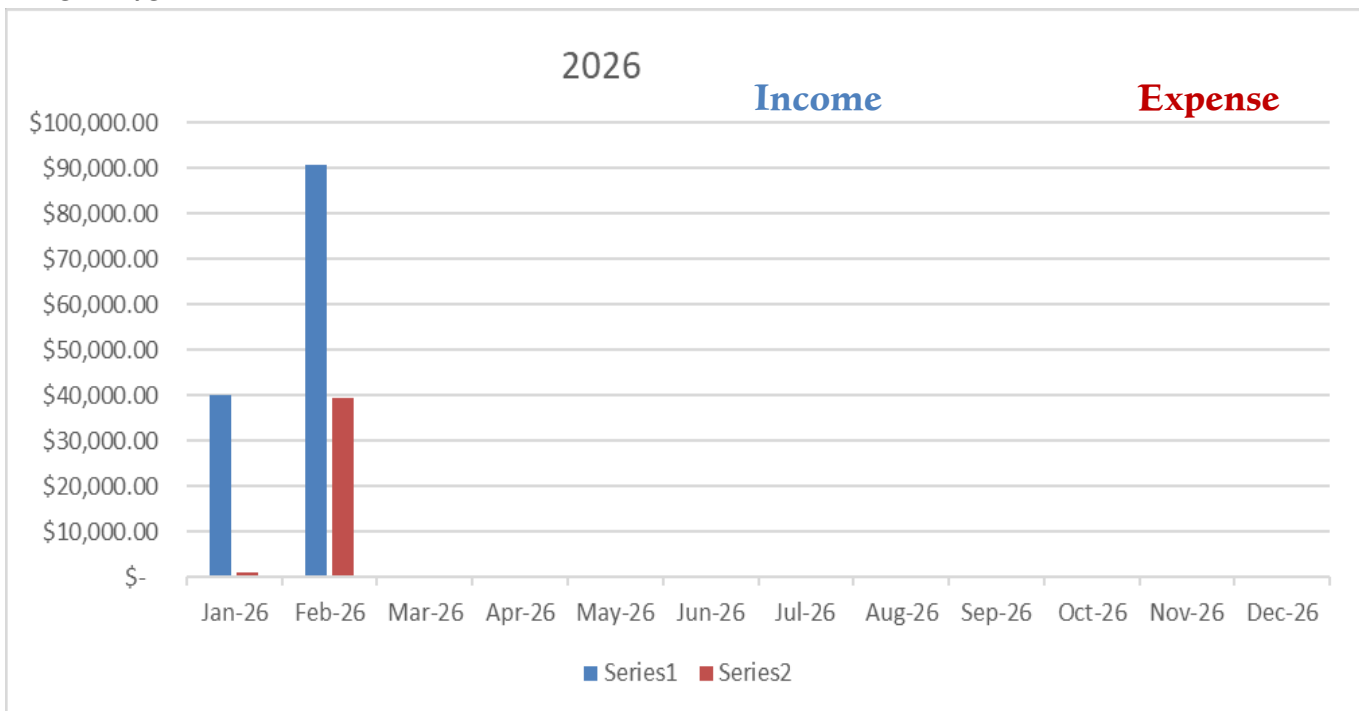
Neighborhood Table is on April 30<sup>th</sup> and we will be looking for volunteers. Currently we are having a Hygiene drive

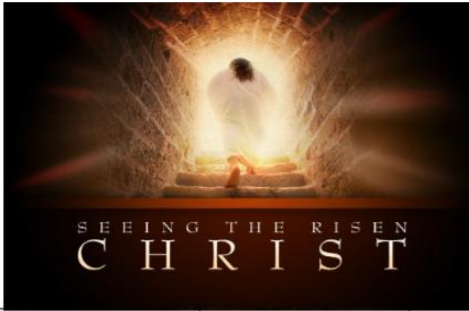

Her husband is killed for plotting to kill Hitler, and she gets whisked away to Normandy. She forms friendships and helps the Resistance. You will have to read to find out if she ever sees her son and daughter again. It is worth getting to page 242.

*Between Sisters* by Kristin Hannah. Meghann Dontess and Claire Cavenagh are sisters that were once lost to each other, about to come together in a time of both joy and sadness. Sisters by blood, strangers by choice, each stands at a crossroads, afraid to confront the betrayals and heartbreaks of the past. They will be reunited at last, drawn by tragedy into the darkest of times, and must figure out how to face their deepest fears together or lose everything. 425 pages and well worth the read to see what happens. There are even questions in the back for a reading group.

*Winter Garden* by Kristin Hannah. Meredith and Nina Whitson are as different as sisters can be. The tale their mother tells them is a captivating, mysterious love story that spans more than sixty years and moves from frozen, war-torn Leningrad to modern-day Alaska. Nina's obsession to uncover the truth behind the story will send them all on an unexpected journey into their mother's past, where they will discover a secret so shocking, so terrible, it shakes the foundation of their family and changes who they believe they are. 391 pages with reading group questions and a couple of recipes in the back.

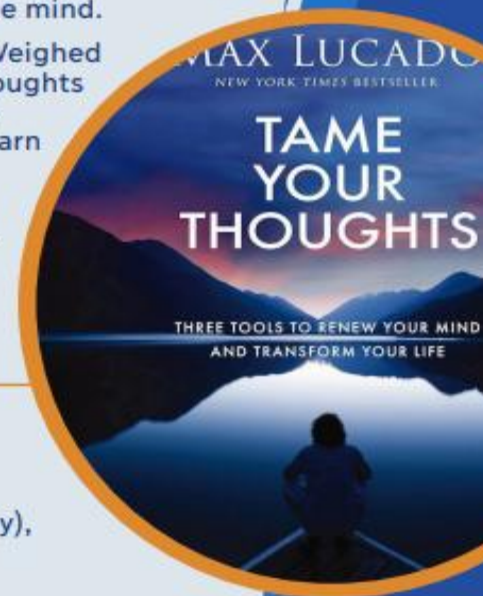
