“An Update on Our Associate Pastor Call Process”

Well... this is not quite the sequel we were hoping for.

In the last newsletter article, I encouraged everyone to tune in to Call Day at Concordia Seminary St. Louis with hopeful anticipation that St. Luke's might receive a seminary graduate as our next Associate Pastor. We had interviewed excellent candidates, prayed earnestly, and submitted our request with confidence in the Lord.

At this point, however, it appears unlikely that we will be receiving a seminarian this year.

That news is disappointing. We had hoped to welcome a new shepherd fresh from the Seminary—especially someone who could help strengthen our ministry of member care and visitation. We were seeking a compassionate pastor to serve alongside me and care for God's people here at St. Luke's. While that particular path now seems to be closing, the Lord is not finished writing the story.

Sometimes God says “yes.” Sometimes God says “not yet.” Sometimes God says, “I have another plan.” So what comes next?

Our congregation will now begin the process of gathering nominations and requesting a Call List from our District President. That list will include pastors who are already serving in the field and may be eligible to receive a Call to St. Luke's. From there, we will prayerfully review names, seek counsel, and move forward in good order.

In other words, we are not at the end of the road—we are simply taking a different exit ramp.

This is where you come in. Please pray for St. Luke's as we continue this important process. Pray that the Lord would guide us to the right man at the right time. Pray for wisdom for our leaders. Pray for patience for the congregation. And pray for the pastor and family whom God may already be preparing, even if we do not yet know their names.

Also, if you know of a faithful pastor whom you believe would be a good fit for St. Luke's, please share that name with our leadership. Recommendations can be helpful as we consider possibilities. While no human process is perfect, the Lord often works through the insights and experiences of His people.

As Proverbs 3:5-6 reminds us: *“Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make straight your paths.”*

We may not have gotten the answer we expected, but we still have the promises of God. And those have never once failed. So keep praying. Keep trusting. Keep encouraging one another.

And who knows? The pastor God has in mind for St. Luke's may already be preaching somewhere this Sunday, completely unaware that Wisconsin is about to get much more interesting.

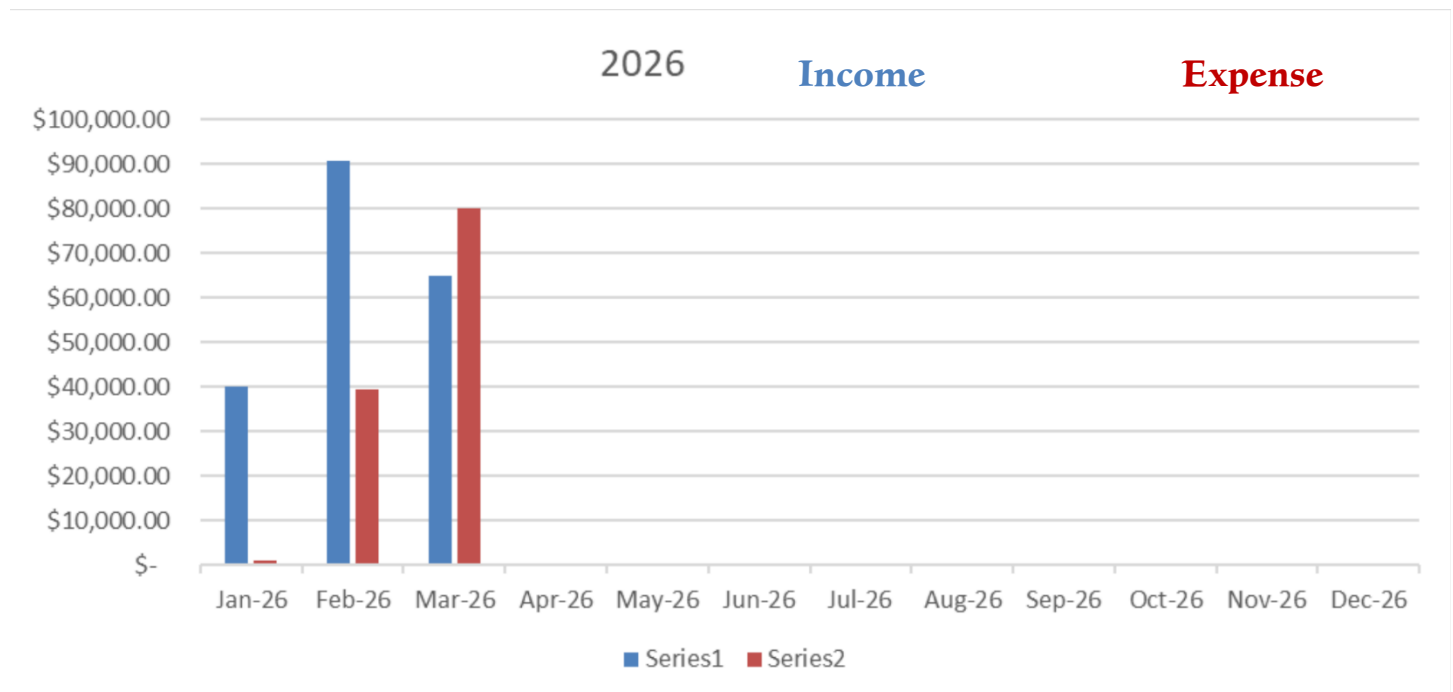
Other Business-
